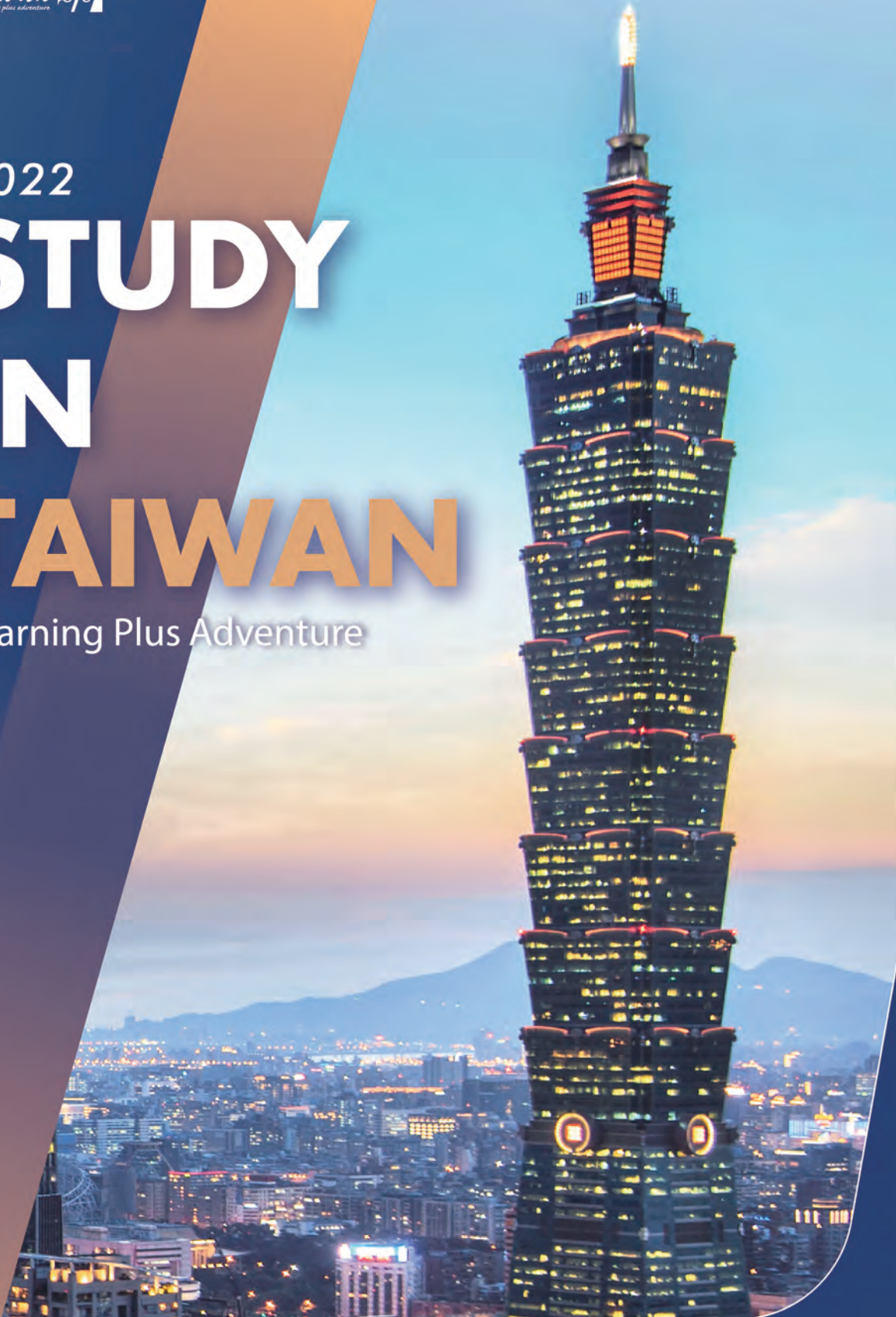

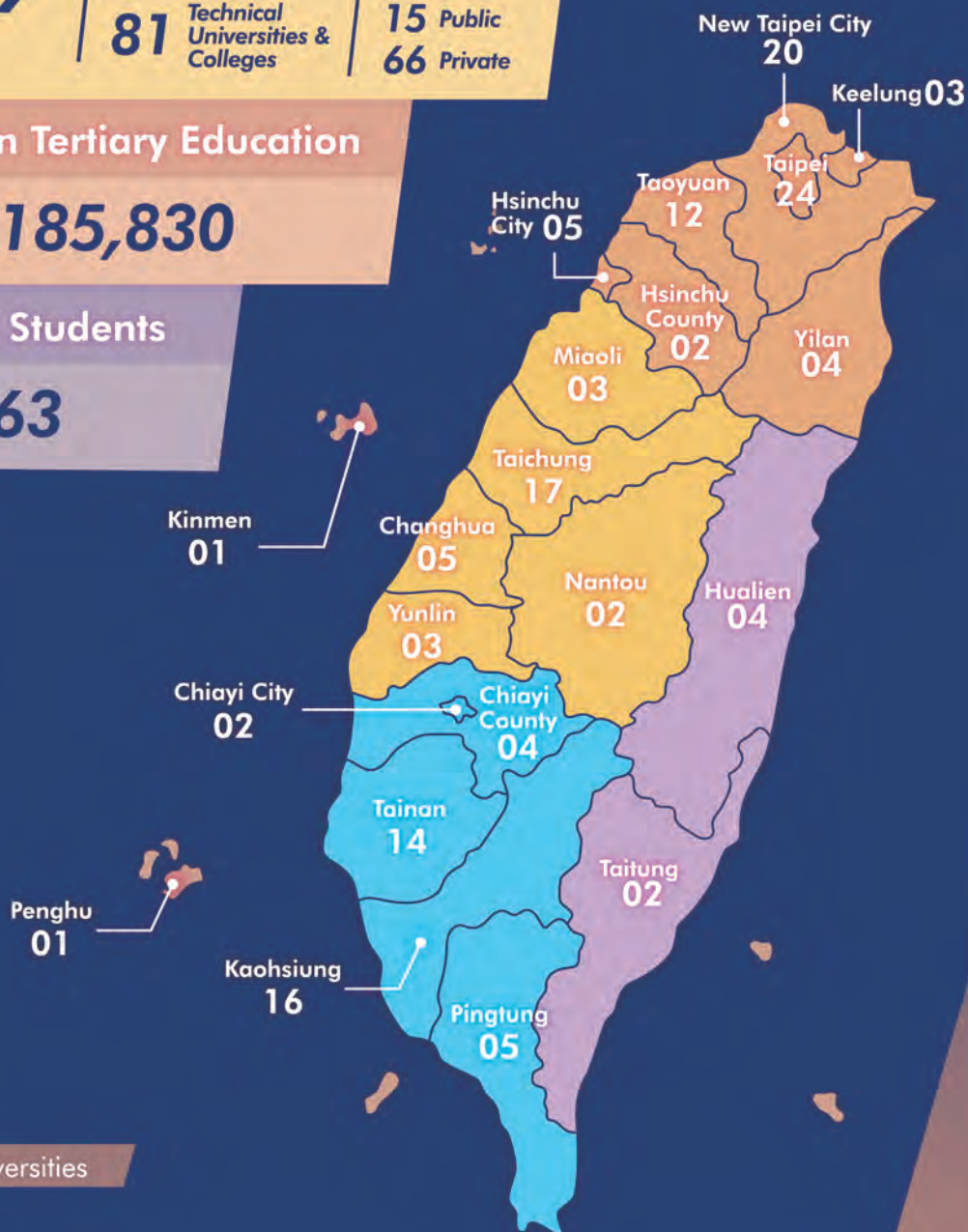

Studying in *Taiwan*

Taiwan's Education System

In Taiwan, students can pursue higher education at 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities. Undergraduate programs usually require 4 years of study; graduate programs leading to a master degree require 1 to 4 years, and doctoral programs require 2 to 7 years. In most institutions of higher education, the academic year has two semesters: the first semester is from August to the following January, and the second semester begins in February and ends in July.

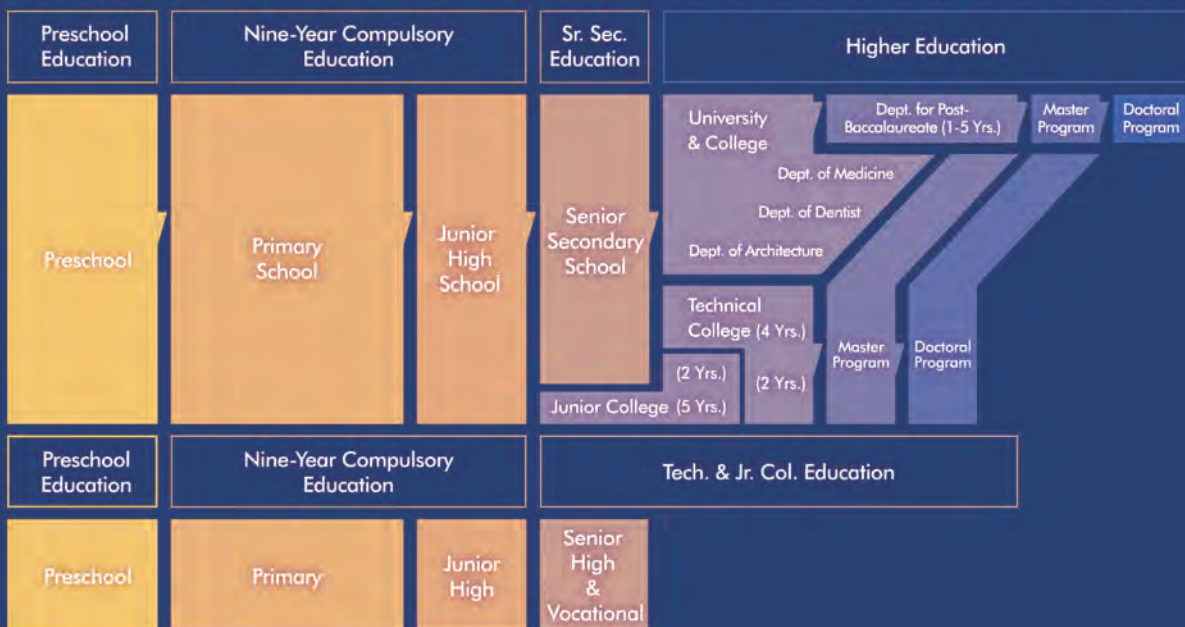

Academia Sinica Taiwan International Graduate Program

- Duration: 3 years maximum
- Monthly stipend: TWD 34,000
- Eligibility: Applicants must possess a bachelor's or master's degree, or the equivalent, from a foreign university or independent college accredited by the Ministry of Education of Taiwan

TaiwanICDF International Higher Education Scholarship Program

- Duration:
Undergraduate program : 4 years maximum
Master's program: 2 years maximum
Doctoral program: 4 years maximum
- Monthly stipend:
TWD 12,000 for undergraduate students
TWD 15,000 for master's students
TWD 17,000 for doctoral students
- One round-trip, economy-class ticket for the most direct route to Taiwan
- Eligibility: Applicants should be nationals of countries with which the Republic of China (Taiwan) has diplomatic relations or developing countries friendly to Taiwan
