

U.S. issues

- Too few students for Taiwan at any school
- Variety of majors at each school
- No one partner in Taiwan can provide all
- Limited institutional resources
 - Need placements for all interested students
 - Curriculum Committees review each program

Taiwan issues

- America: too big, diverse, and decentralized
- Limited administrative resources



Why CSAT (I)

Consolidated market: Taiwan hub

Why CSAT (III)

Student Placement

Students matched with the university and location that best meets their academic requirements, professional goals, and personal preferences

Credit Translation

transcript assessment/pre-approve of credits

Full range of courses taught under similar titles as in America:

- Grades, Syllabi, & Credits translated to the U.S. system
- Faculty credentials and courses description provided
- Most faculty trained in America with Ph.D.



Why CSAT (IV)

 Assisting arranging: Internships & Working Experience

 Teaching Practicums: Affiliated with universities' English teaching programs

 Learning Chinese : Finding the most effective Chinese second language courses

 Finance: No extra cost for students to study aboard



Internships & Working Experience

- Students' placements by the host university.
- The placement in:
 - Non-profits
 - Businesses
 - Local business
 - Social enterprise
 - STEM industry
 - Science
 - Lab



- Students work with a lab supervisor or program coordinator at host university and are supervised by English speaking faculty.
- Competitive and limited



Teaching Practicums

- Teachers in practical training placed in a local school in cooperation with a County Education Bureau.
- Placements in:
 - Primary schools
 - English teaching classes
- Students supervision
 - Local Teacher (LT) mentor
 - English speaking faculty from TW university
 - Overseen by CSAT
- Competitive and limited



Chinese Second Language Courses

- Intensive language learning and cultural activities: focus on immersion in a Chinese speaking, cultural environment
- Language learning may also be integrated into majors: Business, Engineering, Fine Arts, Political Science, Biology, etc.

Student Finances

- Students normally pay their American institution its tuition
- Financial aid is the decision of each institution
- Institution pays the Consortium a flat fee
- Semester fee of \$7,950 covers, in Taiwan:
 - Tuition: the equivalent of 12 to 18 hours of course work.
 - Housing: typical dormitory in host university.
 - Language Instruction Expenses: the equivalent of 3-6 hours of U.S. semester credit within the 18 hours; often also a language buddy
 - Culture Enrichment Activities: events organized by CSAT and/or the Taiwan partner institution
 - Practicum Expenses: fewer regular courses; replaced with a Teaching Practicum or Internship course. Includes supervision, reflection, and evaluation. Practicum & internship placements are limited and competitive.

Short-term & customized programs available.



Student Finances

- Students need to prepare the following (approximately):
 - Meals: \$200-300 /month
 - International Airfare
 - Miscellaneous: \$100-200 /month
 - Health insurance [After 6 months, students are enrolled in Taiwan's modern and comprehensive healthcare system] otherwise students must provide their own.]





Faculty Internationalization Initiative

- A U.S. institution enrolls twelve or more (12+) students
- Over a three (3) year period
- One U.S. faculty member is eligible for a fellowship
 - \$15,000 + housing
 - Teach one semester at a CSAT Taiwan partner (selected by FSE & the U.S. institution).
 - Normal commitment: 2-3 courses
 - Home institutions encouraged to provide sabbatical or supplement




Why Taiwan
